During **Holy Week** we will be offering **Evening Prayer** at 4pm on Mon 15<sup>th</sup>, Tues 16<sup>th</sup> and Wed 17<sup>th</sup>. **Luke 19.28–40**

<sup>28</sup> Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. <sup>29</sup> When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, <sup>30</sup> 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. <sup>31</sup> If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this, "The Lord needs it."' <sup>32</sup> So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. <sup>33</sup> As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' <sup>34</sup> They said, 'The Lord needs it.' <sup>35</sup> Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. <sup>36</sup> As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. <sup>37</sup> As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the

whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, <sup>38</sup> 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!' <sup>39</sup> Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.'  
<sup>40</sup> He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'
